

Seed fairs should be organized twice or three times a year, **before** each planting season.

Our team will organize it – First Week of November and Mid June Season

Guidelines for Conducting Community Seed Fairs

- 1. To ensure Women Participation
- 2. To create awareness of local crop diversity/**Different Crop Varieties** in community
- 3. Platform should be used for **A. Discussion** on **i**) SEED, **ii**) Local practices and knowledge linked to specific seed varieties **B. Showing and Exchanging** the seed, showcasing and sharing their best varieties/crop seed.
- 4. Focus on **local crop diversity** (improved, local, neglected and collected crops)
- 5. The planning, design and preparation of seed fairs affordable for rural farmers
- 6. The **community feels ownership** of it.
- 7. The seed fair should be given a Theme and Objectives.
- 8. Seed fair should has pre-decided the **Planning of activities.**
- 9. The 'Seed Fair Committee' and Activity-Coordinators must plan in advance
- 10. Monitoring and evaluation

Theme: What is the main message = गाँव का बीज मेला / हमारा बीज मेला

Objectives:

- 1) Objective 1: Raising awareness of local crop diversity at the rural community level
 - •Displays of crop diversity, with judging and awards for the best displays.
 - •Presentations by very knowledgeable farmers on the crop diversity that they conserve.
 - •Sketches, songs and dances related to crop diversity.
 - •Links project presentations on the findings of field research

2) Objective 2 : Encouraging community-level production of crop diversity

- Sale or exchange of local varieties.
- Exchange of information on local varieties.
- •Planning of demonstration plots, including at the local school or with a farmer (quality declared seed [QDS], very knowledgeable farmer or other).

Seed Fair Committee will decide:

- 1. PLACE for fair -? Can we arrange it in Government school/ panchayat ghar/ Community seed bank/ Play ground
- 2. Day for fair -?
- 3. TIME 10.00 AM TO 5.00 AM
- 4. Culture Activities Time?
- 5. Seed display bamboo basket/ leaf of plash/ soil pot? And Paper/cartoon Cuttings? and Marker? And Chart Paper?
- **6. Stall arrangement** in ground Table/Soil?
- 7. Seating arrangement Cloth/chair ?
- **8. Stall no**. and registration -?
- 9. Tea and lunch time and arrangement ?
- **10.** How to carry the seed -?
- 11. How to manage sunlight/rain/others Shed/Tripal/Cloth?
- **12.** The quantity of "Seeds for Sell" and "Seed for Display" should be clearly classified. Minimum half kg seed should be represented as display.
- **13.** The quantity of seed for sell purpose **not more than five kg** for per crop and per variety.- These selling seed should represent only **coming planting season.**

- **14.** Distribute empty seed packets to be filled by participating farmers ahead of time and sticker for labelling
- **15.** Public Awareness for time, place and objectives of seed fair.
- **16.** How will close the seed fair?- closing session? cultural music by women/ men + tea + samosa?

EXIT INTERVIEWS

Exit interviews with farmers as they left the event, to determine whether they actually exchanged the seeds they brought and had new varieties to take home.- **Video Recording**

Stall – Representative

- Describe about the seed
- Seed variety related information
- Traditional knowledge and practices like planting season, harvesting season etc.
- Interactive presentation about optimal seed selection from healthy plants, seed cleaning and drying, and different options for seed storage.

Certificates and Award

Certificates will be given to all Registered Stall participant

Award: community seed bank will provide two times of seed via passbook with a specific entry as awarded seed rather than general exchange based distribution to other farmers for the coming planting season. **Or/+ 500 Rs.**

Farmers were awarded from one to five points for each of the following criteria:

- Number of crops;
- Number of varieties of a crop;
- Quality of display;
- Innovativeness;
- Quality of presentation.
